




When Saturday November 15 between 10.30 and 5.00pm. The workshop will go for 3 or 4 hours dependent








Book review

Infertility is mentioned, as well as birth parents, and both subjects are handled with sensitivity while still being very easy to understand by a young child. The central tenant of this tale is the intense love that the family felt on the night the child was born to them; this idea of instant, unconditional love leads to discussions of family and belonging.

KAIAN is a newly established not-for-profit organisation formed for and by adult Korean adoptees in Australia, following in the footsteps of successful American and European "KAD" organisations.



The mission of KAIAN is to provide information, raise awareness, and build a supportive community for Korean adoptees nationwide. KAIAN seeks to connect adoptees not only with each other, but with the larger Korean Australian community and the international network of Korean adoptees. We currently hold regular social and cultural events, mainly in Melbourne, Sydney, and Perth, and hope to expand to Korean language classes and mentoring programs for younger adoptees depending on funding and interest.



WHO are Extended Families Australia?

They are a not-for-profit incorporated association that provides positive connections, support and respite for children aged 0—17 with disabilities and their families in Melbourne and the Mornington Peninsula.

Extended Families seek to widen social networks, empower individuals, promote inclusion and strengthen the bonds people have within their local area.

Established in 1978 as the Foster Grandparents Scheme, the program pioneered volunteer visitor support and friendship to children with a disability living in Victorian residential institutions. As times and social policy have changed, so has Extended Families. They now support families caring for their children at home through a broad range of volunteers of all ages and cultures. The volunteer provides the child with caring friendship and inclusion whilst parents receive flexible respite, feel supported and enjoy having someone to share their experiences with.


What they do

Children and families who are supported by Extended Families have access to a number of flexible support options founded upon volunteering models including individualised volunteer matching for social, recreational and respite support, supported play groups, friendship groups and social events.

Family Match Program

Individual volunteers (or volunteer families) provide long term companionship and flexible respite support to a child/young person and their family. Volunteers may spend regular time with a child, and sometimes the family either at the family's home, a community setting or the volunteer's home. Activities range from playing games or reading a book, to visiting the park, going swimming, seeing a football match or giving support to include the child in community activities and events. The focus is all about the child having fun, developing and extending life skills and experiencing positive social experiences. Help can also be provided for things like medical appointments. A flexible and sensitive child-focused, family centred approach means that arrangements may look different for different families. Our qualified Regional Coordinators work diligently to recruit, train and match a volunteer with a child and family and then foster and support the relationship.


Journal Club will meet Thursday October 1 from 8.00pm—9.30pm at the Fairfield Community Room, 121 Station St, Fairfield.
