

Child safety reporting process

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Who can report?	Parent/Carer Child Director, employee, contractor, or volunteer
What to report	<ul> <li>Any Child Safety concerns, including:</li> <li>Disclosure of abuse or harm</li> <li>Allegation, suspicion, or observation</li> <li>Breach of Code of Conduct relating to Child safety</li> <li>Environmental safety issues</li> </ul>
Concerned and don't know what to do	What if I am concerned about something but not sure if anything inappropriate has happened yet? Complete child safety incident <u>form</u> .
	Call 000 if a child is in immediate danger Otherwise Call PCA Families Child Safety Officer and get advice about whether to make a report
How?	Child Safety Incident Form, Face-to-face verbal report, letter, email, telephone call or meeting
Who to?	Child Safety Officer (PCA Families' Program Director) or employee
What happens next?	<ul> <li>The Child Safety Officer or employee will:</li> <li>Offer support to the child, the parents/carers, the person who reports and the accused staff member or volunteer</li> <li>Initiate internal processes to ensure the safety of the child, clarify the nature of the complaint and commence the disciplinary process (if required)</li> <li>Decide, in accordance with legal requirements and duty of care, whether the matter should/must be reported to Victoria Police or Child Protection and make the report as soon as possible.</li> </ul>
Outcome	Investigation: outcome decided; relevant employee, volunteers, parents/carers and child notified of outcome of investigation; policies, procedures updated where possible (subject to Victoria Police and/or Child Protection investigation requirements).
