and Responding to Challenging Behaviour



Jenn is a Board Certified Behaviour Analyst (BCBA) and highly skilled clinician who utilises the science of behaviour analysis to guide assessment, strategies and implementation approaches within a positive behaviour support and trauma informed practice lens. Jenn's practice of specialists areas of behaviour change include direct intervention with individuals and their supporting team and family to ensure the rights of the person are protected through the provision of effective and evidenced based service delivery.

This presentation provides an understanding of challenging behaviour including:

- Knowing the common reasons will provide why challenging behaviour occurs and how to avoid triggers for escalation and
- behaviour.

PCAF is delighted to announce that with a small grant through ICAFSS (Intercountry Adoptee & Family Support Services), a monthly face-to-face peer support group for parents of adult intercountry adoptees has been established with the first session commencing on Wednesday 25th October. The second session for this year is tomorrow night at North Fitzroy Library.

The need for intercountry adoptive parents to access opportunities for mutual sharing of the joys and challenges of their adoptive parenting journey has long been recognised as profound benefit for sustaining strong, ongoing relationships with adult adopted children.

It is anticipated that the group's discussion topics will emerge from the needs identified by participants and will be guided by knowledge gained from evidence-based research and professional experts, as well as by the rich, shared wisdom of participants' lived experiences.

Central to this peer support group will be the establishment of a safe, non-judgmental space for sharing experiences and a deep sense of trust and respect for participants, together with a good deal of hope and humour.


