In 2021-2022 we:

- •distributed all \$3 million Flexible Funds available
- ·dealt with 18,606 calls in and out

- •provided 30 peer support sessions, with a mix of virtual and face to face

News - Flexible Funding

As a result of increased demand relating to service needs and delays from COVID, at the start of September 2022 PCA Families had already realeased \$1.1million of the \$2.7 million received to distribute in 2022-2023.

In 2021/2022 the program distributed \$3.068 million for the year ended 30 June 2022. This included \$2.7 million annual funds and the "one-off" COVID-19 specific funds. During this time, we were fortunate to be able to support additional families during the peak of COVID 19 pandemic with the additional funds.

The PCA Families Flexible Funding team continues to work to ensure that all Flexible Funding requests are considered and that funds are distributed to best meet these additional needs of children, young people, and families within the pool of funds that we have.

As we work towards fair and equitable distribution of these funds, it is important to keep in mind that the Flexible funding guidelines state that flexible funds can only be considered when all other funding options have been exhausted, and no other source of funding exists.

DFFH Flexible Funding

If your child or young person is on a Permanent Care Order or you receive the DFFH Care Allowance and they have a Family Court Order or Adoption Order, they are entitled to DFFH Flexible Funding to meet the costs of goods and services they need not covered by the care allowance, or another funding source (eg Medicare, NDIS). Flexible funds can be used for therapeutic, educational or medical services, build skills interest or attachments, support birth family contact and cultural identity, respite, medication, vehicle modifications. For more details on what the funds can be used for see here. Claims should be more than \$100 per invoice and generally paid by PCA Families directly to the supplier. To ensure funds are distributed fairly and equitably and are appropriate and safe for your child, we ask for supporting documentation that services are trauma informed and that both goods and services are recommended by a professional who knows your child or young person.

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
